SPECIAL RULES

1. Fair will furnish paper plates, 5" and 9", for display, and cups for the herbs.
2. Juniors are age 12 to 17; Children are age 5 to 11. Be sure to **NOTE AGE** on pre-registration entry form.
3. Challenged individuals may enter as Juniors. Do not state age on entry form.
4. After judging is completed, exhibitor may decorate their display. Check with superintendent for proper time.

Entry Suggestions and information:

All Fruits and Vegetables - Need showmanship and uniformity.

Apples - With stems, light polish with soft cloth only, wash off spray residue.

Beans - Short even length stems.

Beets - Tops trimmed to one inch, tap root trimmed to 1.

Carrots - Tops trimmed to one inch, no green shoulders, trim roots even.

Corn, sweet - Husks removed completely, shank trimmed to 1 inch, display in transparent bag.

Cucumbers, 3 slicing type - five inches or longer, 2 inches or less in diameter.

Cucumbers, 10 Pickling type - less than 3 inches long.

Cucumbers, 5 pickling type - three to five inches long.

Eggplant - One large - oval or oblong

Eggplant - Three small - slender oblong, or round, each uniform with the others

Garlic - Dried, braided together, or tops trimmed to one inch, cleaned and minimally peeled if necessary.

Grapes - Trim stems and rake out about half of berries.

Herbs - Tied in bunch, but just before bringing to Fair; tips will be cut again before placing in water in cup for display.

JacOlanterns - judged for best shape, not size.

Kohlrabi - Tops trimmed to two inches, and tap root trimmed to one inch.

Melons - need stems, must be clean

Onions - Tops trimmed to 3/4 inch, well cured and dried, not peeled, roots cut just below bulb, should be clean and unsightly, bulb skin pulled away.

Onions, green - Tops on, but trimmed evenly, leave short root.

Peaches - NO stems, wipe off spray residue

Peppers - be sure the color remains correct for judging day

Pomegranates - remove damaged leaves.

Potatoes - name variety, and wipe off dirt.

Pumpkin - identify correctly, especially the large varieties

Squash - needs a healthy stem piece

Vegetables - Baby and Miniature sz, display twice the number required for conventional size, if not listed show six of one type

Vegetables - Ornamental, Display three

Vegetables - Misc info, if number req is not shown, display same # as a similar size crop that is listed

Common Exhibit Faults that Judges often find:

1. Too many or too few specimens.
2. Variety is incorrect or not stated.
3. Specimens are improperly exhibited.
4. Specimens lack uniformity in type, size, shape, color or maturity.
5. Specimens are too large, too small, too old, or too young.
6. Specimens show injury from insects, disease, weather, or handling.
7. Specimens are wilted or dirty.
8. Specimens are poorly trimmed, peeled too close, or scrubbed too much.
