### SPECIAL RULES

1. This department is for **FRESH CUT & DRIED FLOWERS** and **FLOWERING & FOLIAGE PLANTS** that have been grown by the exhibitor for a minimum of three (3) months prior to the Fair.
2. Only ONE (1) entry per Lot; with ten (10) entries in Department 106.
3. All entries must be prepared in accordance with good show procedures, and MUST have the number of specimens as called for in each lot.  
NO ADDED FOLIAGE.
4. The exhibitor must know what kind of specimen they are bringing to exhibit, and have them entered in the proper class and lot. Judges will be looking for healthy, extraordinary specimens.
5. Entries *may be* disqualified if not properly classified.

6. Transporting Exhibits: See General Regulation #12. If entering a large size plant, please state size of container and overall height of plant ON THE ENTRY FORM, in the description column.
7. **NOTICE:** The Fair Committee will not be responsible for loss or breakage of containers. We recommended that exhibitors mark their entries on the underside of containers. See General Regulations #1
8. **Child** is age 5-11; **Juniors** are age 12 to 17. Be sure to **note age** on Pre-registration entry form.
9. **WARNING:** *If the exhibit is picked up/taken before the release time, that exhibitor will not be allowed to enter the following year.*
